EXTENDING A DECADE OF IMPACT

The Chicago Architecture Center (CAC) offered a completely reimagined Open House Chicago (OHC) for 2020 in support of public health. OHC 2020 featured nearly two dozen online programs and 25 self-guided, outdoor trails that showcased the fascinating architecture, culture and history of 100+ buildings and sites in 20+ neighborhoods and select suburbs.

Originally slated to run 10 days, October 16–25, OHC 2020 was extended by popular demand through November 1, 2020.

The CAC and the entire OHC community extend heartfelt thanks to everyone who took part in this expanded, 10th annual festival, reconfigured to encourage civic pride, support 80+ local businesses selected in partnership with Choose Chicago, and highlight the City of Chicago's INVEST South/West initiative.
